### **DIY Flower Vases**

## Supplies:

Free Printable 3D Vases (6 designs including blank one to colour your own!) created by The Art Dream
Coloured cardstock
Decorative straws
Tape, regular and double-stick
Heart puncher (one inch)
Scrap tissue paper
Glue
Scissors

#### **Instructions:**

- 1. For the vase, print out the design you like, and fold in the flaps along the scored lines and along the center black lines. Use double-stick tape or glue to tape to a piece of colored cardstock.
- 2. For the flowers. Cut out hearts using your heart puncher. For each flower, use five hearts. Fold hearts in half. Then line them up side-by-side in a circular shape and tape the back (or use glue). Scrunch up a small piece of tissue paper and glue it to the centre of the flower. Tape the flower to a decorative straw. You will need to snip the straws at the bottom, as they will be too long for the vase.
- 3. Cut simple green leaves. Use tape or glue to adhere to the straw flowers.
- 4. Repeat for as many blooms as you would like in your vase. We used five flowers per vase. Simply add the flowers inside the vase. Use double-stick tape to secure to cardstock so they do not fall around or move.

# Paper bag tree

# Supplies:

Paper bag Glue Tissue paper

## Instructions

- 1. Turn the paper bag inside out
- 2. Crumple the bag and twist to make the trunk
- 3. Tear the upper parts of the bag to make the branches
- 4. Crumple up small pieces of tissue paper and glue them onto the branches.

### Paper DIY Umbrellas

## Supplies:

Colour papers
1-light blue cardstock
Scissors
Glue
Yarn
1-pipe cleaner
1-toothpick (for applying glue)

### **Instructions:**

- 1. Print out the circles from the template provided you can grab them at the end of this tutorial (use different colour papers, whichever colours you like).
- 2. Cut the circles out. For one umbrella, you can go with 9 or 10 circles.

## Making the Canopy

- 3. Start by folding one circle in half.
- 4. Do this to all of the circles.
- 5. Then fold that piece in half too.
- 6. The end piece should look like a pizza slice.
- 7. Repeat this step with the rest of the circles.
- 8. Open the pizza slice and apply some glue in between the corners. You can help yourself with a toothpick or similar.
- 9. Then fold the piece again and press with your fingers until the glue dries or use clothespins to hold the pieces together while the glue dries.
- 10. Repeat this step with the rest of the circles.
- 11. Press firmly.
- 12. Put some glue on one end borderline and then glue a pizza slice on (refer to the picture on the website and make sure you apply the glue on the right side so that you can open the umbrella afterwards).
- 13. Repeat this step with the rest of the slices, and then press with your finger until the glue is set.
- 14. Put some glue on the borderline of the last pizza slice, then open the umbrella and connect the ends. Hold until the glue dries.
- 15. Using your fingers, widen the spaces of each pizza slice. That way we make them equal.
- 16. Take the pipe cleaner and carefully put it through the hole.

### The Handle

- 17. Then make a hook and cut the excess out.
- 18. Apply some glue on each pizza slice and glue each of the yarns on the umbrella
- 19. Do this for all your raindrops
